Chunghwa Post Issues Special Stamps Commissioned by the MAC for "30th Anniversary of Cross-Strait Exchanges" Activities to Promote Goodwill Interaction Across the Taiwan Strait

Chunghwa Post today (September 20, 2017) issued a set of special stamps commissioned by the Mainland Affairs Council (MAC) to commemorate the 30th anniversary of cross-Strait exchanges.
