MAC Urges CCP to Improve Cross-Strait Relations

The Mainland Affairs Council (MAC) stated today (March 5, 2024) that the

"Two Sessions" (National People's Congress and Chinese People's Political

Consultative Conference) of the Chinese Communist Party (CCP) are part of the

CCP's routine internal political agenda. This year, the CCP's official report

focuses on internal governance, with particular emphasis on strengthening

responses to post-pandemic internal and external challenges, boosting the

sluggish economy, and reinforcing weiwen (the maintenance of social stability).

In response to the policy stance on Taiwan reiterated in the CCP's

government work report, the MAC emphasized that our government remains

committed to its consistent position on maintaining peace and stability across the

Taiwan Strait. It will firmly defend the sovereignty of the Republic of China and

Taiwan's free and democratic system. The MAC also again urged the CCP to

acknowledge the objective reality that "neither side of the Taiwan Strait is

subordinate to the other," abandon its rigid political thinking, and engage in

communication and dialogue with Taiwan without political preconditions to create

favorable conditions for healthy and orderly exchanges and positive interaction

between the two sides.
